Lt. Rob Wilson from the SE NSC reported that since our last meeting there have not been any violent incidences, including burglaries, robberies, car thefts, or assaults, in the NEMNU borders. At 1416 Culver Rd was a shootout that resulted in the owner being charged with murder, Melville St had a homicide that is under investigation. There is nothing on an armed robbery at the 700 block of Cedarwood Terrace.

The stolen Kia/Hyundai cars are 2010-2020. The internet shows how to use a usb cable to start the cars. There are 10,000 cars in Rochester. They are taken all times of the day or night and used for demolition derby's, robberies and shootings. There are several gangs involved. Kia has sent steering wheel devices but they go quickly. There is a lack of consequences. There have been 39 smash and grabs, 19 in SE area. There are 7 laws that have been changed that chip away at consequences. He explained the triangle of Crime prevention and discussed illegal guns.

Members asked for safety suggestions. He said to be aware of your surroundings and if something doesn't seem right believe it.
